Incidents of Note:

Nuisance Motorcycles: I continue to receive reports of nuisance motorcycles within rural villages, in particular Aylesham. On my patrols, I have stopped several motorcyclists and checked the condition of these vehicles and reported any riders committing offences. Off road motorcycles and E-Scooters continue to be an issue. Please be aware, that once stopped, these vehicles WILL be seized, and the riders reported for offences under the road traffic act. These vehicles are not registered or insured for use on British roads, and therefore can only be ridden on private land.

Shopliftings – Aylesham: On review of the last months reports to Kent Police, I note a visible increase in shopliftings in retail premises in Aylesham. These may be of small value, however this is clearly still an offence. Most reports involve juveniles who are believed to be local as are recognised within the stores. Please ensure you speak with your children regarding this issue and ensure they are not involved and make them aware of the consequences if identified by police. I will be seeking the assistance of local schools to identify those involved and increase police presence within the village to try and reduce these numbers and deal robustly with those involved.
