Incidents of Note

8th/9th/10th June 2024 – Three separate reports of Theft Shoplifting offences (one on each day) from Co-Op, Market Square, Aylesham. Enquiries and investigations still ongoing at this time.

14th June 2024 – Overnight from the 13th June to the 14th, two offences of taking a motor vehicle without consent at Miners Way Business Park, Aylesham. First vehicle accessed by suspect(s) unknown and moved in order to steal a second vehicle from the location. Stolen vehicle was a works van.

15th June 2024 – Reports in the evening of a male causing a disturbance within the village of Eythorne. Police attended and male located and arrested for 2 x assault and 1 x criminal damage. Male issued a Community Resolution the following day.

16th June 2024 – Several reports of Theft from Motor Vehicle in Snowdown. We believe this was also linked to offences on neighbouring Canterbury District. Three youths have been arrested and are currently released on police bail whilst enquiries are ongoing. It must be stressed that even when emotions are high, it is important that these matters are reported to police rather than an investigation via social media. Naming possible suspects on social media platforms can cause a safety risk to those named as well as seriously undermine a police case in the future. All offences to be reported either by 101 / Kent Police website / 999 in an emergency situation.
