These are readily available now and easily connect to home internet giving peace of mind and also acting as a visible deterrent to would be criminals. Most of these cameras have very good night vision capability built in.

Safer Business Week took place during October 2024. I visited many rural businesses across the area and provided safety advice and handouts with tips to avoid crimes such as shoplifting and other retail offences. It was nice that this advice was so well received by all.

Please also be aware of rogue traders during this time of year. These will often visit properties of those more vulnerable offering to carry out jobs such as leaf clearing, jet washing or general maintenance work. This work is often overpriced and unnecessary. What I am seeing is once a small job is instructed, these rogue traders will then find extra 'essential' work which will then snowball in price leaving the victims sometimes thousands of pounds out of pocket. 
Items of Note:
